San Antonio High School is located in the city of Petaluma in the southern end of Sonoma County with a population of approximately 59,600. The city limits are 40 miles north of San Francisco and 20 miles south of Santa Rosa.



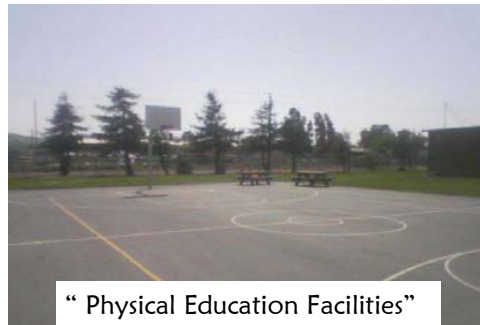
San Antonio High School opened in 1966, with the promise of providing a smaller setting, individualized instruction, and an alternative pathway to graduation for students sixteen or older at risk of failing in the comprehensive setting. San Antonio's curriculum meets California State Standards and all Petaluma City Schools graduation requirements while focusing on the various learning styles and the needs of students. In addition, San Antonio houses a very successful teen parent program that provides for the academic and health needs of students 14 and over and their children before and after giving birth. Services include prenatal care and daycare while students attend classes.

San Antonio High School provides opportunities for students to pursue career opportunities through outside work experience and Regional Occupational Programs (ROP). Special interests can be met by enrollment in classes at the comprehensive high schools, junior college classes and in adult education courses. Students sign a contract upon enrollment that underscores the importance of positive attendance, appropriate behavior, academic achievement, and personal responsibility.



Student Support

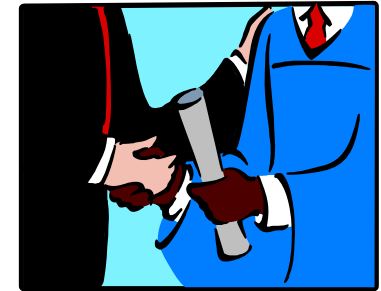
The students of San Antonio High School are among the most supported students in the Petaluma City School District. Every student has a learning plan that is specially tailored to the student’s academic goals and needs. Upon entry into our program, each student is assigned a teacher advisor who tracks the student’s progress and concerns, both educationally and personally. Communication among teachers, counselors, support personnel and principal help monitor students who are at-risk academically. The staff holds bi-weekly “Kid Check” meetings to closely monitor our students’ progress and success.

Program Offerings

In order to best serve our students, San Antonio has added pathways for students to succeed. Students may enter into an Independent Study Program if they have special circumstances or would benefit from the model. The current schedule has been expanded to include more classes and a greater breadth of academic and elective choices. The opportunities for accelerating toward a diploma are varied and abundant. Aside from core offerings, students can choose from a variety of elective classes including,

but not limited to, two-tiered Art classes, AVID Program, Media Studies, additional English, Math, Physical Education, and Life Skills classes. Students can also be teacher assistants for elective credit, giving them the opportunity to work more closely with teachers, further building the teacher-student rapport.

Students can also gain credit and enriching experience by participating in the child care program, as well as our annual Health and Wellness Fair that takes place every Spring.
